INTERNATIONAL 1920 MATCH DIRECTOR'S CHARTER

It is the purpose of this Charter to provide Pistol Australia (PA) with the rules governing the formation and management roles for the position of International 1920 Match Director.

- 1. Name:** International 1920 Match Director.
- 2. Objective:** To develop and promote International 1920 Match shooting throughout Australia.
- 3. Director:** The Director will be elected for a period of two (2) years.

The position of Director shall be determined by election at the Annual General Meeting of Pistol Australia Inc. Nominations will be accepted from any member of PA.

Responsibility to propose or to recommend amendments to the Regulations for the operations of International 1920 Match shooting, which will be submitted to the Management Committee for consideration.

- 4. Finance:** To be provided by:
 - i.** PA
 - ii.** Other sources

5. Special Clauses:

Once International 1920 Match shooting has become an operationally self-sufficient PA competition, the position of International 1920 Match Director may become redundant.

Such decision will be made by the Executive Committee at the appropriate time.

REGULATIONS

- 1. Aim:** To achieve the objectives set out in the Charter for the International 1920 Match Director by:
 - 1.01** The development and promotion of International 1920 Match shooting to PA members and the community, particularly through the shooting media and competitions;

- 1.02 The assessment, planning and development of International 1920 Match shooting and ensuring compatibility with international practices; and
- 1.03 Monitoring the activities of the State International 1920 Match Directors.

2. Management:

The Director shall be responsible for:

- 2.01 Liaising with State Directors and encourage all States to develop and promote International 1920 Match shooting;
- 2.02 Representing PA on the Organising Committee for the National International 1920 Match Championships and report on a regular basis to keep PA informed;
- 2.03 Recommending guidelines for the conduct of National International 1920 Match Championships;
- 2.04 Recommending a national standard for the training and accreditation of PA members for the safe and proficient handling of pistols whilst participating in International 1920 Match shooting events, and modifications as and when required;
- 2.05 Making submissions to the NRC and NCC for programmes to enable NRC and NCC accreditation for International 1920 Match shooting;
- 2.06 Recommending to and consulting with the NRC to establish national guidelines and interpretations of the NRA Action Pistol shooting rules;
- 2.07 Formulating and recommending a plan for the establishment of a National Squad (International 1920 Match shooting);
- 2.08 Submitting timely reports on International 1920 Match shooting activities to PA Management, State International 1920 Match Directors and the *Australian pistol Shooters Bulletin*;
- 2.09 Submitting within 30 days of any International 1920 Match shooting activity that involved expenditure of money in excess of \$250.00, a detailed report on the prescribed form to PA Management;
- 2.10 Developing a budget for International 1920 Match shooting for timely submission to PA Management;
- 2.11 Reporting to PA Management on performance against budget as and when required;

2.12 Reporting to each PA Management meeting and also annually, at the Annual General Meeting of Pistol Australia Inc., on International 1920 Match shooting activities; and

2.13 Carrying out such matters or things as are conducive to or incidental to International 1920 Match shooting activities.

3. Miscellaneous:

Amendment to these Regulations will be by way of recommendation to Pistol Australia Management for consideration.
