- Match 5** The Team Match. This is a non-fired (paper) match. The team award shall be based on the aggregate total of each team member's individual scores from matches 1, 2, 3 & 4.
- Match 6** The Iron Man Event. A combination of Matches 1, 2, 3 & 4 in both Open and Metallic Sight will determine the winner of The Iron Man Award.
- Match 7** The Metallic Sight Event. The aggregate of each individual's Metallic Sight score in Matches 1, 2, 3 & 4.
- Match 10** The 22nd Pistol Australia International 1920 Match National Championship. The aggregate of each individual's score in matches 1, 2, 3, & 4 shall determine his/her final standing and the winner of the tournament.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

- All nominations with accompanying fees must be received by 18 September 2010. The signing of the entry form by the competitor and the club secretary is a declaration attesting to the correctness of the information contained in the entry form.
- 2009 NRA Action Pistol rules, with official amendments and PA Supplementary Regulations, will apply.
- Chronograph ammunition will be collected at all events and tested over a chronograph for power factor.
- Competitors will be expected to act as target changers and observers for the next detail of competitors and will be squadded for work details.
- **All resident Australian competitors must be current financial members of Pistol Australia Inc. and carry a current State / Territory / PA grading card. Presentation at Equipment Check of current PA Holster accreditation card is mandatory.**
- Provisional State Team Entries must be received by the closing date of the 18 of September 2010.

CLUB RULES

- Alcohol may only be consumed after you have completed your shooting for the day.
- Full metal-jacketed (hard ball) projectiles are not allowed. Semi-jacketed and jacketed hollow point projectiles may be used.
- Smoking is not permitted in the clubhouse.
- Geelong Pistol Club Inc. is a registered club. Under the firearms act, all visitors MUST sign the visitor's book when entering. Children must be under the supervision of an adult whilst on the premises.

2010 INTERNATIONAL 1920 MATCH NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS MATCH DIRECTOR'S BULLETIN

FALLING PLATE EVENT

1. Sight pictures will be permitted at the beginning of each distance upon request.
2. Plates must fall to count. Any plate prevented from falling by the locking mechanism will count as a miss.
3. Shooters must sign their scorecards before leaving the range. The letter 'M' on the scorecard must identify metallic scores.
4. Competitors will be assigned positions by using their competitor numbers as identified on the range sheet.

MOVING TARGET EVENT

1. Shooters will select their targets and fill out the stamp at the bottom with their competitor no. and target no's 1-4.
2. Each shooter will have 7 ½ minutes to complete the event. The time will commence from the time the shooter steps into the 10-yard box where a sight picture will be permitted. There will be no handling of firearms outside the 10-yard box.
3. Shooters will put up targets and RO for the next shooter.
4. Competitors will be assigned positions by using their competitor numbers as identified on the range sheet.

BARRICADE & PRACTICAL EVENTS

1. Shooters will select their targets and fill out the stamp at the bottom with their competitor no. and target no's 1-4.
2. Sight pictures will be permitted at the beginning of each distance upon request.
3. On completion of the event, shooters will put up targets and observe for the next detail.
4. Competitors will be assigned positions by using their competitor numbers as identified on the range sheet.

SCORING AND CHECKING OF TARGETS

Cardboard target events will be scored in the score shed. Competitors are not to go beyond the desk without permission. Please be patient with the scorers as they may be busy. The competitor must check scored targets within two hours of completing their event, after this time, the score stands. If you wish to challenge a score, write 'CHALLENGE' on the score sheet and bring it to the attention of staff in the score shed. The referee will judge the target at the earliest opportunity.

IRON MAN.

Competitors shooting both the 'Open' and 'Metallic' matches for the iron man must ensure their targets are marked accordingly i.e. 'O' or 'M' in the identifying stamp on the target.

CHRONOGRAPH

Three rounds will be taken on each range for each event. Chronographing will be carried out with a common firearm. If a competitor's ammunition fails on the 1st attempt, the competitor will be notified and given the opportunity to provide their own firearm for the remaining rounds to pass Chronographing requirements.

OTHER

1. Firearms are not to be worn off the range.
2. Gun checks will be carried out prior to the match at registration.
3. Staging areas are clearly identified on each range and must be used accordingly.
4. Sight pictures are available on request to a maximum of one sight picture each distance.
5. There will be no jump test. A dropped firearm, loaded or unloaded, will result in immediate disqualification.
6. Competitors are to shoot and carry out their allocated range duties in accordance with the range squadding sheets.

JURY / JUDGES / REFEREES

PA will select Judges and Jury from suitably qualified personnel Australia wide.
